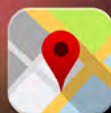

Just like yesterday, the family of the Oyedirans relocated from Chicago Illinois to become the parish pastor of a newly formed Redeemed Christian Church of God in Huntsville Alabama. Today 10 years later, the church has become a home to thousands of people in Alabama. Jesus House Huntsville is a unique place of worship and an atmosphere of divine encounter. In 2008, Pastor Eneefa Fenny, the parish pastor of RCCG Jesus House Birmingham was inspired by the Holy Spirit to start another parish of the church in Huntsville, AL.

Every Sunday evening after regular church service in Birmingham, Pastor Eneefa and his family travels down to Huntsville to conduct bible study for the first set of families they could put together. The beginning was very challenging, sometimes they will drive down to Huntsville and before getting to the assigned venue, the few people have gone back to their various houses because they all need to prepare for work the next day.

Through persistence and hard labor, they were able to raise few members who often meet with them every Sunday evening for bible study. This group of bible lovers began to yearn for a more frequent and regular meeting. This yearning led them into prayers and Pastor Enefaa started making contacts through the redeemed Christian Church of God to find a resident pastor who would like to relocate to Huntsville.

It is worth noting that in 2008, only a handful of Africans were around and this group comprised mostly lecturers and students who were always busy. People in the bigger cities were reticent about coming to Huntsville, Alabama. Finally, Pastor Bayo Adewole of Jesus House Chicago called Pastor Peter to his office and told him there was an assignment for him in Huntsville AL. Pastor Peter did not take much time to even think and consider because he already knew his time and moment of assignment has just begun. Today, the rest is history! Ten years and we are just beginning.



Meet Pastor
PETER OYEDIRAN

- ▶ **CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT YOUR CHILDHOOD?**

By the grace of God, my name is Pastor Peter Oluseun Oyediran. I grew up in an Anglican house hold and I was born into the family of Late Pa Alfred Oyediran and Late Mrs. Comfort Oladoja Oyediran. My dad was an Anglican priest and we hailed from Ibadan, Oyo State, Nigeria. After the passing of my dad unto glory, I decided to live with my elder sister late Mrs. Cecilia Oyetunji.
- ▶ **CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND?**

I had my primary education at the last place my father pastored; which was St. Thomas Anglican School Iroko before proceeding to Iwo grammar school. In 1986, I finished my secondary school education at Iwo. In 1989, I attended Oyo State School of Nursing Ibadan where I graduated as a Registered Nurse in 1992. Furthermore, I proceeded to Neuro-Psychiatric hospital Aro, Ogun State, in Abeokuta where I graduated as specialized Psychiatric Nurse in 2003. Presently, I am completing a Bachelor's degree program at Western Governors University.
- ▶ **CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT YOUR WALK / PATH WITH THE LORD?**

Honestly, I had no plans of becoming a Pastor at all. My plan was to serve the Lord and my goal was to become a Medical doctor or a Pharmacist. In 1989, while in nursing school, I thought I was finally free from home, since I was off to College and my life was on track, and I could do whatever pleases me, and date as many ladies as I want, however, I had no idea that God had a different plan for me. I attended a nursing school fellowship which was a welcoming service for new nursing students in November of that year. As the man of God was preaching, I found myself in front of the altar and I surrendered my life to God.
- ▶ **WHEN AND HOW DID YOU RESPOND TO GOD'S CALL AS A PASTOR?**

Immediately I gave my life to Christ, there was tremendous outpouring of support from fellow believers in the nursing school. With the strong spiritual leadership, nurturing and guidance from the nursing school fellowship, I began to discover my walk with the Lord and I noticed a lot of changes in my life. At the end of the year, I became the secretary of the school fellowship for about two years until I graduated from school. I do not take that experience for granted.
- ▶ **CAN YOU GIVE US A BACKGROUND INFORMATION ABOUT THE FORMATION OF RCCG JESUS HOUSE HUNTSVILLE?**

I attended Redeem Bible College in Birmingham, Alabama. Also, I attended School of Disciples back in Nigeria. With that been said, I pastored two churches back in Nigeria before moving to Jesus house Chicago in 2004. Pastor Enefa Fenny (JHBHM) started JHH as a house fellowship, for almost one year he went back and forth between Birmingham, AL and Huntsville, AL every Sunday. It was later moved to 2907 Governors drive and that was when it became a church. Finding a pastor for the church was difficult until Pastor Enefa spoke to Pastor Bayo Adewole of (JH Chicago) where I was residing and worshipping at the time. In 2009, I moved to AL after four years of experiencing pastoral life in Jesus house Chicago. In Nov 2009, I started pastoring RCCG Jesus house Huntsville in AL.
- ▶ **CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY (WIFE & CHILDREN)?**

When I gave my life to Christ during nursing school, I took it so seriously and I could not think of chasing women. As a matter of fact, at a point, I had hoped that I would marry one of the nursing female student; little did I know God was preparing a precious Gem for me in the future. I am pleased to inform you that I am married to Pastor Mrs. Kehinde Oyediran and we have four children in all. I thank her so much for her tremendous love and support to me, the children, career and the church. Her prayers, love and support has taken my ministry and career to the highest levels.
- ▶ **WHAT IS THE VISION OF THIS CHURCH AND YOUR PERSONAL VIEW TOWARDS IT?**

The vision for Jesus house Huntsville goes in line with RCCG and our main goal/vision is to make heaven. I follow the vision of RCCG worldwide itself. And my personal vision is to develop individuals into maturity in God's work, having the capacity to proffer solutions to critical problems, and above all, offering assistance to everyone I come across in life.
- ▶ **TELL US ONE BITTER EXPERIENCE YOU WILL NEVER FORGET AS A PASTOR?**

My bitter experience was when the church wanted to purchase the main church auditorium. It was so challenging that I almost gave up on everything especially when people tend to talk behind my back without knowing the other side of the story. To God be the glory he gave me faith and strength to look forward and ignore the negativities behind me. I listened to people in terms of advice, but God prevailed victoriously. My advice to others will be whenever you embark on any journey, hold on to God, walk with people that have the same vision as you, let God be your anchor and trust in Him. Also, passing my NCLEX board exam when I got to the States was a challenge at first but after several trials, God gave me victory over it.
- ▶ **WHAT IS YOUR VISION FOR THIS CHURCH IN 2019?**

By his infinite mercy, as we proceed into 2019, I want to focus on evangelism and community outreach program. I want to develop a portfolio of programs that will make the church an integral part of the community. These programs will focus on several areas of ministry and the community such as prison outreach, community health and safety, medical missions (if the resources are available), food banks to feed the indigent and homeless people in the community, and most importantly taking the gospel to the next level outside of church.
- ▶ **HOW DO YOU BALANCE MINISTRY, CAREER, FAMILY, AND DAILY LIFE?**

In general, it has been hectic but with my wife standing and supporting me, and most importantly God almighty by my side, I have been able to manage it all and keep things under control. However, it has not been easy I must confess because I have a lot on my agenda but God is still faithful to see me through it all.
- ▶ **WHAT IS YOUR FINAL WORD WHEN YOU REFLECT BACK ON YOUR JOURNEY FROM NIGERIA TO AMERICA?**

God is ever faithful to his word. As many that trust in him, he will never put them to shame. Also, all those going through trials, should never give up because it will be turned to joy and celebration very soon.

DECORATIONS & BEAUTY

The art of decorating and beautifying involves the use of a combination of colors, shape or form to adorn, and make things look beautiful and attractive. Decorations involving the use of different accessories can be done to beautify humans, places or things. Its importance is the first impression that it creates and this depends on the beautifying elements and accessories used. The impact and influence of proper decoration cannot be underestimated. The workers are the Body of Christ who come together to beautify and decorate His sanctuary, from the top to the least, be it Pastor, Minister, Deacon/Deaconess, Protocols, Ushers, Decorators, Media, Sanctuary keepers, Sunday School teachers, etc. They all have a role to play in beautifying and decorating the Sanctuary in honor of God. In other words "Decoration or Beautifying" is not only putting or using accessories or ornaments to beautify that which serves as attractions. It also means total devotion and commitment to Him, and ensuring that whatever God commits to our care is well kept and used to the glory of His name. God who knows his sheep by their names will beautify and decorate the works of our hands with everlasting honor in Jesus name.

SOME EXAMPLES IN THE SCRIPTURES

The Shunamite woman was one of the virtuous women devoted and faithful to God's work despite her inability to bear a child. She was humble and continued to serve God faithfully. She provided food and shelter to Prophet Elijah and God beautified her womb with a child (2 kings 4:8-15).

Esther was another virtuous woman who surrendered herself to save her people by serving God faithfully. Through her commitment to God, He decorated her with the great honor of becoming a Queen (Esther 2:16-17).

Finally King Solomon, a great man of wisdom was also devoted and committed in his service to God's work. He beautified and decorated God's Temple with beautiful sculptures on the wooden door of the temple made with fine olive wood, flowers of best scent, as well as beautiful cedar. He also decorated God's temple with gold. When God asked him what he wanted, he didn't ask for riches, nor wealth, nor good health, nor the death of his enemies, nor or long life. Rather, he asked for God's divine wisdom and God in His divine sovereignty decorated and beautified Solomon with riches, great honor and other things including long life (1king 3:10-14).

In conclusion, if you devote your time to beautifying and decorating God's sanctuary by submitting yourself in obedience to the voice of the Holy Spirit, you will attract God's attention. When you give him the chance to take total control of your entire life as HIS dwelling place, he will decorate and beautify your life with great honor because you have chosen to make your body His Sanctuary where He will dwell forever.



INTERPRETATION OF OFFENSE

An offense can be described as an ill feelings, annoyance, or resentment brought about by a perceived insult or disregard to someone’s standards or principles. Based on its definition, it is pertinent to mention at this point that our perceptions are not always right.

An offense can also be described as the devil’s bait to lure believers to sin. (Ephesians 4:26-27). Knowing fully well that sin is a robber of blessings. Wisdom requires that one should take precautions about getting easily offended, and if it eventually comes, do not allow yourself to be dragged into sin, rather make a frantic effort to overlook the insult.

DANGERS OF OFFENSES

Problems associated with offenses include backsliding, strife, sin of disobedience to God and those in authority over you, anger, unforgiveness, resentment, unanswered prayers, emotional distress, physical sickness, and battered relationships. This can eventually lead to physical and spiritual death with the resultant effect of eternal condemnation. (Ezekiel 18:20)

HOW TO OVERLOOK OFFENSES

The Bible makes it clear that offenses will surely come most especially if you are relevant in the work of the kingdom. What you are not sure of is when, how, and to what extent? It is therefore your responsibility to make a strong decision that you are unstoppable; and that nothing can separate you from the love of Christ.

(Luke 9:62) You cannot afford to let other people’s actions, thoughts or words destroy you or ruin your relationship with your maker.

THE FOLLOWING POINTS CAN BE USED IN MAKING DRASTIC EFFORTS TO OVERLOOK OFFENSES:

Make excuses:

Give people the benefit of doubt, perhaps they are having a bad day or dealing with some other issues in their lives. It could be a misunderstanding and the person might not mean any harm (Proverbs 17:9)

Meditate on the Word of God:

Use the word of God as a standard to get rid of any root of bitterness and speak peace into your situation. Create an open mind and atmosphere and allow the Holy Spirit to heal and restore.

Pray without ceasing:

To be a carrier of the fruit of the Spirit as written in the Book of Galatians 5: 22- 23, requires constant prayer because the human flesh contradicts the fruits of the Spirit. You also need to pray for those who have offended you because no one is perfect. (Ephesians 4:32)

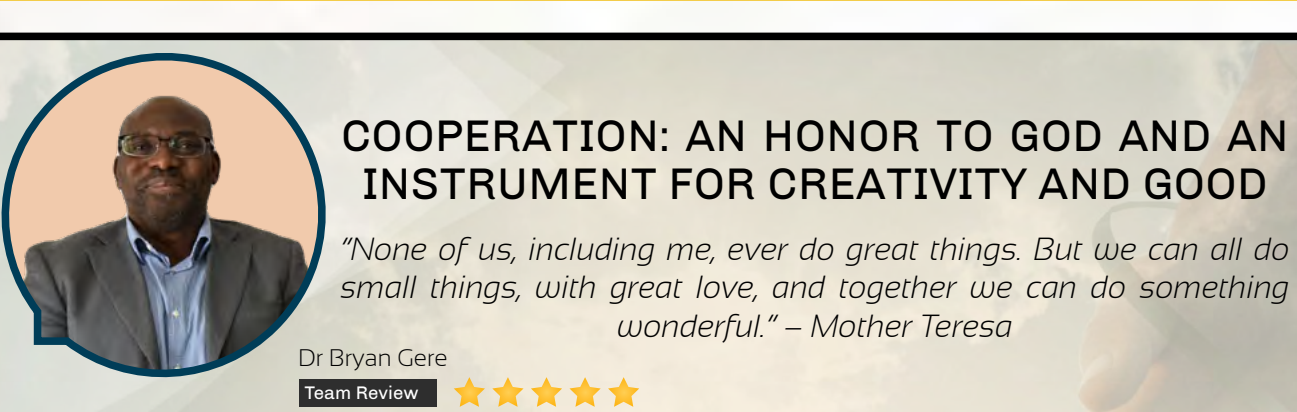
Examine the “Self In Me”:

Some people are so easily offended due to the pride of life or just focusing on their own selfish interests. Learn to address the issues of life from different perspectives rather than just focusing on yourself. Also, sincerely examine yourself for any acts of low self-esteem, envy, hatred, or jealousy from your side. (Gal 5: 19-21)

Correct with Love:

Always remember that Christ died for us while we were yet sinners. Your love for people and the work of the kingdom will help you to overlook a lot of faults and wrongdoings while correcting with the love of Christ Corrections made with love yield better result than that made while keeping grudges. Galatians 6:1

In conclusion, offenses are inevitable, but you should not allow that to drag you into sin by taking necessary precautions such as covering up for people’s mistakes and errors just like the blood of the lamb covers up for your sins; overlook their offenses by showing mercy; and pray often for yourself and others. Christian life is a race with the ultimate goal of crossing the finishing line, so avoid every stumbling block no matter how big or small. The kingdom of God will surely be your inheritance in Jesus name.

One of the greatest disservice that we can do to ourselves as we pass through life is to be unfulfilled in many areas of our lives. When we closely examine our lives, or the communities in which we live, we can see that sometimes even with the best talents , education, finances, and several other endowments that people have, there are still significant disparities between what could have been and what is the reality. CHRISTIAN PARENTING

Proverb 2:26 “Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it”

So why should you now beat the child for telling his/her own lies. That child will not understand, he/she will be confused and feel the punishment is unjustified. Whatever you are correcting them for, let them know the reason why and lead them to the scriptures to make them aware of the implication and the consequences. Do it with love and not with anger or annoyance.

3. LOVE: 1 Corinthians 13:13, 1 John 4:7-8, proverb 10:12, Ephesian 5:25, Romans 13:8. Always express the love of God to your children. Let them know that God is love and they should love God, their parents, sibilings and their neighbor. Let them also be most aware of the unconditional love of God and likewise the love of a parent for their child. As you teach them, you should allow them to see you love them. THE DOCTOR COLORECTAL CANCER

As a physician and a member of this church, I feel passionate about this topic. One of the many reasons is because I have a family member diagnosed last year with colon cancer, precisely my father. He was 68 years old and of course like many of us never had a screening colonoscopy prior to his diagnosis.

INTRODUCTION — Colorectal cancer (CRC) is a common and lethal disease unfortunately most of my sisters and brothers in Christ are not aware or simply ignore this very important disease (Proverbs 18:15, Proverbs 2:11).

The risk of developing CRC is influenced by both environmental and genetic factors.

EPIDEMIOLOGY: CRC incidence and mortality rates vary markedly around the world. Globally, CRC is the third most commonly diagnosed cancer in males and the second in females, with 1.4 million new cases and almost 694,000 deaths estimated to have occurred in 2012.

RISK FACTORS:

1. Low socioeconomic status,
2. Age is a major risk factor for sporadic CRC. Large bowel cancer is uncommon before the age of 40; the incidence begins to increase significantly between the ages of 40 and 50.
3. Gender- incidence is about 25 percent higher in men than in women.
4. Race-African Americans have the highest CRC rates of all ethnic groups in the United States. CRC mortality is about 20 percent higher in African Americans than it is in whites
5. Personal or family history
6. Inflammatory bowel disease- Ulcerative colitis, Crohn's disease.
7. Abdominal radiation history.
8. Tobacco use
9. Alcohol intake

I hope this will be a reminder that we all need to do the needful. Thank you all for your time.

Colonoscopy is used both diagnostically and therapeutically and permits examination and treatment of the rectum, colon, and a portion of the terminal ileum.

Colonoscopy is indicated for the diagnostic evaluation of signs and symptoms of a wide variety of gastrointestinal disorders, for colon cancer screening, and for therapeutic interventions.

INDICATIONS FOR COLONOSCOPY:

- Abnormal imaging
- Lower gastrointestinal bleeding and unexplained iron deficiency anemia
- Lower gastrointestinal symptoms (e.g., chronic diarrhea)
- Screening/surveillance
- Colon polyp
- Colon cancer
- Inflammatory bowel disease
