# CREATIVITY: THE INHERENT GOD IN US

I am an artist, and so are you. An artist is one who is able, by virtue of imagination and talent or skill, to create works of value. To create means to bring something into existence. Therefore, an artist is someone who brings things into existence, which never existed before. An artist creates out of imagination. This article is aimed at bringing you into the realization of the fact that you are an artist, a creator.

The bible introduces God to us as the creator. The first verse of the first chapter of the first book of the bible says that God created the heaven and the earth. The fascinating narration of creation takes us through the steps of the act of God, i.e. creating; and the hallmark of all God's creation is that they are good, they are beautiful.

Now, let us take a closer look at the epitome of God's creation, man and woman, you and I. Verse 27 of Genesis chapter 1 tells us that God created man in his own image. You were created in the image of God. So am I, so is Michael Jackson, Albert Einstein, Abraham Lincoln, Olusegun Obasanjo and every human being on earth. Humans are created in the image of God, but all humans do not all look alike, thereby prompting the question "what exactly is the image of God?", that is, what is that unifying attribute of God that we all have in common? What is the trademark of God that was placed in humans to qualify us as being created in God's image? The answer, which we find in Genesis chapter 2 verse 7, is the piece of God himself placed into humans. God breathed the breath of life into our nostrils, and in so doing, placed a huge at-

tribute of Himself into us. Note that the breath of life that God breathed into us did not merely cause us to become alive, [as other animals, sea creatures, plants etc that God created prior to creating man are equally alive but without the breath of God], but God's breath instilled a source of life into us.

By breathing the breath of life into us, God gave us the ability to bring into being that which is not. God gave us the power of imagination; the power to conceive something in our hearts, and bring it to life; the power to create through a thought process followed by the act of speaking our thoughts into life, just as God spoke the world into existence. No wonder God placed the limitation of our actions on the extent of our imagination. "...and now nothing shall be impossible for them to do, which they have imagined to do" (Genesis 11:6). You and I have the God-given ability to create things from our imaginations. Oh what great power we have, yet we know it not! Just like our Father, we can create. We, as artists, can imagine things and bring them into existence. We can use the power of our thoughts to shape the situations and circumstances surrounding us. Now, the dangerous part of this ability is that it exists in all humans. As God breathed the breath of life into us all and gave us an existence in the form of a soul, God has imparted us all with this power. The way that we use the power of creation by the imaginative thought process now depends on us. What good is superman if he is not aware of his super powers?

The creative power that God has impacted into us can either make or mar us, it can either make us become a success or destroy us. The difference between a superman and a villain is how each chooses to use his or her powers. The difference between whether God's power of creativity impacted into us will grant us success or destroy us is simply in how we apply it. I hereby offer you some hints that will steer you into the right direction to use this creative ability. To use this innate ability to your success, and to create things that are 'good' just like God's works, you must apply the power in accordance with God. You must learn from God and think like God, our Father. Jeremiah 29:11 tells us that God's thoughts towards us are good. God thinks good, hence His works are good. You must think good to create good. You must always renew your minds to be transformed (Romans 12:2). In the creation process, the thoughts are followed by the declaration, the sayings with your tongue. Your tongue has the power of life and death (Proverbs 18:21), so you must use it to declare life, and not death, into your situations. I hope that you will start living your life from now on with the realization that you, like God, are a creator, that you can bring things into existence, that were not, and that you can use this ability to change every situation in your life. You can create your excellence; you can create your success. You are a creator, an artist.

# 6 Keys to parenting the Christian way

The book of Proverbs 22: 6 admonishes the parents to “train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it”.

The roles of parents in nurturing their children in a godly way are very important and cannot be overstressed. The book of Isaiah 8:18 declares that “I and the children that God has given unto me are for signs and wonders”. The responsibility of training the children starts from home. Parents should never leave their children to cater for themselves. They should do their best to train and bring them up them in the way of the Lord. Children need to be corrected when they do something wrong, rebuke them with love and sternness (Proverbs 22:15; 23:13).

However, let me call the attention of the children to what the Bible says in the book of Proverbs chapter 4, verses 10 through to 12.

**10 Hear, listen, my son, accept what I say, and the years of your life will be many.**

**11 I instruct you in the way of wisdom and lead you along straight paths.**

**12 When you walk, your steps will not be hampered; when you run, you will not stumble.**

Children, it pays so much if you listen to your parents and obeys their instructions.

Parents have to tenaciously engage in the following obligations in a bid to nurture their children in the way of the Lord:

**1. Teach them total obedience:** Obedience is the key in Christian parenting. Parents need to teach their children how to obey completely. Deut. 28: 1-13 says “if you will obey God completely then you will be above only and you will never be beneath”. Exodus 20:12 says “Honor your father and your mother that your days may be long”. Several people have incurred God’s wrath and lost their God-given destiny because they failed to obey their parents.

**2. Teach them to avoid evil company:** It is not every friend that you should allow to be seen around your child. 1 Corinthians 15:33 says “evil communication corrupts good manners”. Proverbs 13:20 says “a companion of fools shall be destroyed”. Endeavour to teach them to choose their friends wisely.

**3. Teach them to pursue wisdom:** “Wisdom is the principal thing, therefore get wisdom and with all thy getting, get understanding” says Proverbs 4:7-9. Wisdom is greater than strength. Do not let your children spend all their days watching television, sleeping or playing video games, they must study their books and learn to read their bibles. Proverbs 22: 29 says “if you work hard, you will stand before kings and not ordinary men”. Education is the only cure for ignorance.



**4. Teach them to seek and serve God early in life:** “Remember now thy creature in the days of thy youth while the evil days have not come nor the years draw nigh and when you shall say I have no pleasure in them” Ecclesiastes 12:1. Teach your children to seek the Lord early in life by praying and developing personal relationship with God among others. They will never regret doing so later in life.

**5. Teach them to be appreciative:** Teach your children how to appreciate good things from their childhood. Elisha cherished Elijah; he ended up with a double portion of his anointing. What your child appreciates doing from childhood is what he or she may become later in life.

**6. Teach them the importance of working for God:** Let your children know that God can begin to use them even as from childhood. Samuel started hearing from God as a child. In the book of 1Timothy 4:12, Paul, when admonishing his son in the Lord, Timothy said “let no man despise thy youth, but be an example of the believers”. It is your God-given responsibility to plant your children in the work of the ministry, for they are the future of the church.

Finally, as a parent, you cannot afford to just teach your kids by words of mouth alone, teach them by example. Example, they say, is better than precepts. Children are watching, it is not what you are saying that really matters, but what you do.

I am appealing to you, parent, yet not be born again to surrender your life to the ANCIENT OF DAYS who can take care of you and your entire family.

# INTERVIEW WITH PASTOR PETER

**Q: In your own words, how will you describe RCCG Jesus House Huntsville to anyone?**

**A:** As one of the Parishes of the RCCG located in North America, RCCG JHH is a church where the love of God reigns supreme. A church, not limited by walls, that embraces people of all races, cultures and nations of the world. We connect to the outside world through electronic media and social networks using our church website, facebook, television adverts/ programs etc. RCCG JHH is a place to discover your God-given potentials and become what God has ordained you to be in life and in the work of the ministry.

**Q: Can you mention some of the landmark achievements and breakthroughs made since the last church anniversary?**

**A:** To God be the glory, great things He has done. The church enjoyed divine backings and financial breakthroughs for all the programs held in the passing year. Furthermore, our members experienced and testified of the Lord's goodness in such areas as divine healings and deliverances through anointing services, resolution of immigration issues, successes in professional board exams, promotions, better job placement and safe deliveries for our pregnant women among others. We are believing God for the acquisition of an ultra modern mega church with built-in facilities particularly spaces for the children chapel and teenagers' church among others.

**Q: Under your leadership, in what ways has the church impacted her immediate community in the outgoing year?**

**A:** By God's grace, RCCG JHH is like a city set on the hill that cannot be hid. The church gives financial supports to the less privileged in our community through the Rescue Missions. Our parking lot is always open for public use without any charge during the week days and weekends. The Summer Family Picnic held in August further facilitated fellowship and interaction with the members of our community. We plan to continuously impact our immediate community through launching of babysitting program, hospital and prison ministries among others.

**Q: Can you give an assessment of the performance of RCCG JHH in the areas of evangelistic outreaches in the passing year?**

**A:** Actually, we are far from reaching our set goals in the areas of evangelism. However, we are moving towards the higher calling in our evangelistic outreaches through the use of electronic and social media to reach the unreached among others. Our heartfelt prayer is that God will demolish every obstacle and nullify every policy militating against our fruitfulness in this area in Jesus name.



*Q: Kindly share your short- and long-term goals for RCCG JHH in the upcoming years?*

*A: Just as Paul said in 1 Corinthians 3:6 that “I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase”. Our immediate goals include, but not limited to, ensuring spiritual revival in the lives of all worshippers and promoting an atmosphere of love among brethren. Furthermore our vision is to build a befitting Sanctuary for God in the city of Huntsville, Alabama. Ultimately, our goal is to make heaven and lead others to the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.*


## OUR VISION AND PURPOSE:



# HOW FAITHFUL ARE YOU?



One group of people on earth that God is so much concerned about is the children. God loves sonship, no wonder He has a begotten son. He also gave the whole world the ample opportunity to become His children, if only they can believe in His beloved son, Jesus Christ (John 1: 12). Our Lord Jesus Christ, while on earth, equally expressed cordial relationship between Him and His heavenly Father. He hardly talked without mentioning "my father" (see John 10: 30; 15:1). He also embraced and showed unequivocal tenderness and love for little children "for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). This emphasizes God's divine interest in maintaining unbroken life-long relationship with the little children.

A familiar but significant verse of the bible concerning children is Psalm 127: 3. God emphatically states that though we give birth to our children, they are His individual possession. We can only inherit them from Him. If He does not release them to us, we cannot have them in our custody. God had children in mind right from the creation of mankind. He blessed our fore parents with fruitfulness and multiplication, because He had some beautiful gifts to send to this world through them. Psalm 139: 13-16 says God has been there even from conception and all through the formation stage of a child. This reveals the level of interest and dedication God has appropriated to little children.

Then a germane question is, if children are so precious to God, why is He releasing them into the world? Verse 4 of Psalms 127 says, "As the arrow in the hand of a mighty, so are the children". An arrow signifies strength and defense. The Lord knows we need both on earth, and He has given us children for our strength and defense. That is why sometimes when a parent is weak to pray, a little sincere prayer from his/her child can move mountains. Also, verse 5 of the same Psalms said "happy is the man whose quiver is full of them, he shall not be ashamed". God releases these special gifts into our lives for our happiness, supports and honour among others.

We equally need these little ones to attract God's blessings into our lives. In Genesis 18: 19, God said He chose Abraham, but if Abraham wants all what God has promised him, his children must be instructed to follow the Lord. God wants a generational transfer of His laws and statutes, that is why He chose to save us, and He gives us children to accomplish this obligation.

Is there anyone looking unto God for the fruit of the womb? Be rest assured that God has not forgotten you. Just as He remembered Sarah, Elizabeth and Hannah, the Ancient of days will remember you and deliver your bundle of joy into your hands in no distant time in Jesus name. However, not having a biological child yet does not make less of a father or a mother.

Therefore, no one is exonerated from this relevant question. How faithful are you in nurturing God's possessions in your custody?

A lot of parents have failed in taking care of God's heritage in their custody. Remember God chose you because he needs a generational transfer. If you fail to raise your children in the way of the Lord, you have made a fool of God's bias over you. Failing to train the children in God's way is not only a disappointment to God, it is a way of telling God to keep His happiness, strength, defense, delight and honour to Himself (Proverbs 29: 17). It is also a way of denying these children their peace in life (Isaiah 54: 13).

We need to be aggressive in channeling our children on God's path, through prayers, counseling, communication and discipline. Love is not over-pampering or condoning indiscipline. Love is setting your children straight with tenderness and sternness. The bible emphasizes this fact (see Proverbs 22:6; 23: 13 -14; 29:15). Yes, we might be guided by different upbringing rules based on the geographical location, but the bible is the standard, and God does not change His rules irrespective of location.

As humans, we cannot do it right by ourselves, but with God on our side, we can do all things. The Ancient of days will grant us the wisdom, knowledge and strategies to excellently mentor His heritage in our custody in Jesus name. Amen.

# CHILDREN DEPARTMENT

Greetings from the Children's Department of the RCCG JHH. We thank the Lord for fulfilling His promises of multiplication in His household. He has also shown His faithfulness to us by protecting both the children and their parents. We give God the high praise. We equally thank the Pastor and his wife, Pastor and Deaconess Oyediran, all the teachers that have been laboring in God's vineyard, all the mothers and fathers in the house, and all our sisters and brothers as well.

The department is gradually moving forward by the guidance and wisdom of God. Though there are lapses and desires, we believe the Lord will take us into greater heights in upcoming years in Jesus name.

Presently, four teachers work in the department. The number was reduced from seven due to the blessing of college admission for some of our teenage teachers. We have about fifteen regular children at each Sunday service. As the attendance of the kids largely depends on the attendance of their parents, this number can be doubled on some Sundays. The Lord has helped us to divide the children into three classes for now. The first class consists of the youngest set of children, from ages 1 day to 3 years. The second group of children is between ages 4 and 8 years, while the senior class, which is the third group, has children from ages 9 to 13 years.

We also changed the church manual from The Zeal, which is the manual from RCCG, Nigeria to the RCCG, North America curriculum. This is because the children could relate more with the examples and activities of the North America manual than the former.


The department is being faced with a lot of challenges. The first challenge is a working space for all the kids. One of the two rooms is being used by nursing mothers and the youngest group of kids. The other room holds the other two classes and two teachers. We hope to give a room to the nursing mothers to avoid distraction to the youngest group and we are hoping to separate the kids with ages 4- 6 years into another group.

We also need more teachers. We need children of God with passion for kids, both males and females to join the department, so we can jointly mentor these God's heritage in the way of the Lord.

We admonish every parent to nurture every child in the way of God. If we jointly work towards directing them in the right path, they will have no hiding place. If every child knows that doing something bad will incur the discipline of every father and mother in the house of God, they will be cautioned in doing wrong. We equally admonish the biological parents to make the children understand that God and His service should be accorded priority over any other thing on earth. Parents should endeavour to check their children's attitudes at home, follow up the lessons learnt and activities carried out at each Sunday service. Parents can equally help their children in accomplishing church assigned home works. If we dedicate time to seeing them performing well in secular schools, why should we leave God's issue out? It is our responsibility to guard them aright. We believe God will help and see us through in this area.

We look forward to a more exciting year, filled with learning about God, fun and activities in the fear of God. We wish everyone a Happy New Church Year.

# WHAT WENT WRONG?

"Asa did what was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his God" (2 Chronicles 14:2 NIV)... "Asa was angry with the prophet because of the admonition; he was so enraged that he put him in prison. At the same time, Asa brutally oppressed some of the people" (2 Chronicles 16:10 NIV).

Asa was one of good kings of Judah. The writers of the scriptures chronicled his good deeds thus: he did what was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his God (2 Chro. 14:2); he removed the foreign gods and the high places (2 Chro. 14:3, 5); he expelled the male shrine-prostitutes from the land of Judah (1 Kings 15:12); he commanded the people of Judah to seek God and obey Him (2 Chro. 14:4); he trusted God in time of war (2 Chro. 14:11); he repaired the altar of the LORD (2 Chro. 15:8b); he led the people of Judah and even some from Israel to re-establish their covenant with God (2 Chro. 15:10-14); he even deposed his mother, Maachah, from her position as queen mother because of her idolatry (2 Chro. 15:16); and his heart was fully committed to the LORD all his life (2 Chro. 15:17). Because of these deeds, God gave him and his people rest on every side (2 Chro. 14:6, 7). Even when somebody with a vast army waged war against him, God gave him a resounding victory with many plunders (2 Chro. 14:9-15).

Nevertheless, his latter years of reign were a tragedy! He abandoned the Almighty God for a mere man when another country

waged war against him (2 Chro. 16:1-6). When a prophet of God confronted him for his lack of trust in God, he was angry and put the prophet in prison (2 Chro. 16:7-10). He also brutally oppressed some of his people (2 Chro. 16:10b). When he was afflicted with a disease, he refused to seek God (2 Chro. 16:12). Alas, he died in that disease!


One may wonder what actually went wrong in the life of Asa. Why did he start well and ended tragically? The writers of the scriptures did not give a hint about his pitfalls and decadence. Apparently, his successes went to his head and he forgot about the ultimate source of his success and victory, the Almighty God.

## Department




